**As COVID-19 vaccinations continue throughout the United States, the Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) is equipping you with the latest facts and updates.**

### Here is what you need to know:

As you read and hear more about COVID-19 vaccines, you might be wondering what is true. The fact is, COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective, and your best shot against COVID-19. How vaccination combats variants of the virus Viruses constantly evolve through mutation, and new variants of the COVID-19 virus are already spreading throughout the world. Viruses cannot mutate if they do not replicate, so vaccination is important to slow increased case rates of COVID-19 variants. While the CDC is still researching how effective vaccines are against variants of the virus, it is important that residents prioritize vaccination. The more residents who receive vaccinations, the more protection our state builds up to slow all COVID-19 spread, making it more difficult for COVID-19 variants to grow and reproduce.

Preparing for a COVID-19 vaccine appointment All adults over the age of 16 are now eligible for vaccination. Please schedule an appointment before going to a vaccination site. COVID-19 vaccines are available at no cost to those eligible for vaccination. Additionally, no form of ID is required to register and receive a vaccination.

Once you arrive at your vaccination location, follow guidelines to navigate the site. Please note that each site receives different allocations from the various manufacturers, and you cannot choose which vaccine you will be given. After vaccination, ensure you wait in the appropriate monitoring areas directed and keep your COVID-19 vaccination record card in a safe place. If desired, download the [CDC's V-Safe app](#) to monitor post-vaccination side effects and receive an alert when your next dose is due if you received the Pfizer and Moderna vaccine.
