

# 2021 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

### **ECONOMIC RESILIENCY & RECOVERY**

#### **★ Flexible and Competitive Tax Policy**

Support flexibility for businesses utilizing existing incentives to mirror changing economic landscape as well as support new tax policies that will increase our state's competitiveness.

#### Upskilling and Workforce

Support policies to reduce regulatory barriers to employment. Licensure reform offers a chance to get skilled individuals back to work and meet workforce needs.

#### **★ Infrastructure of the Future**

Support additional investments in infrastructure that are integral to our long-term needs and innovation-oriented improvements. This includes everything from broadband and 5G to freight and logistics.

#### ★ Cyber Safe Harbor

Support policies that provide a legal safe harbor for companies that go to the highest standard to protect consumer data as a valuable tool to encourage more robust cybersecurity practices and procedures.

#### ★ Rural Resiliency

Support policies to assist in privately-funded technological infrastructure advancements in rural communities aiding small businesses, colleges, hospitals, and local governments.

#### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

- ★ Support current tax incentives and economic development policies that have proven to attract investment and create jobs in the state.
- ★ Promote policies that strengthen emerging and innovative technology and industries that have potential to grow jobs and economic prosperity.

#### **EMPLOYMENT**

- ★ Preserve Georgia's employment-at-will doctrine and the state's right-to-work status.
- ★ Preserve employers' ability to maintain a safe business environment for employees.
- ★ Examine options for portable benefits such as disability insurance and retirement for non-traditional employees.

### **ENERGY & NATURAL RESOURCES**

- \* Protect statewide access to sustainable, reliable, and affordable energy supplies.
- ★ Enhance access to high-quality, affordable water supplies and ensuring future water supply security for communities and businesses across the state.

#### **HEALTH & WELLNESS**

- ★ Support a state-led approach to ensure the viability of our healthcare system by supporting implementation of federal waiver programs to help small businesses with premium assistance as well as increase access to care for more Georgians.
- ★ Promote cost containment with respect to employer-sponsored health insurance.

### **LEGAL REFORM**

- ★ Extend liability protections from COVID-19 exposure for healthcare workers, facilities and businesses.
- ★ Extend product liability protections for businesses producing personal protective equipment (PPE).
- ★ Improve the balance of the state's legal climate by modernizing Georgia's Civil Practice Act and limiting prejudicial practices of plaintiffs' attorneys.
- ★ Establish liability protections based on a plaintiff's status as an invitee, licensee, or trespasser on landowners' property.

#### **RURAL RENAISSANCE**

- ★ Support funding for a government-wide support team for rural communities.
- ★ Incentivize rural healthcare workforce pool expansion.
- ★ Extend jobs tax credit for businesses creating rural remote positions.
- ★ Support enhancing regional economic development cooperation.

### **TALENT & WORKFORCE**

- \* Promote policies that increase awareness and access to higher education options for Georgians as well as the return on investment of a degree program based on anticipated income.
- ★ Support policies that improve college persistence and completion rates to provide an employable and adaptable workforce.
- ★ Promote the continued and expanded investment in public and private research.

#### **TRANSPORTATION**

- ★ Support continued strategic investment of state funding into Georgia's transportation network to promote economic growth and greater quality of life.
- ★ Support efforts to expand Georgia's capacity to transport freight.
- ★ Support strategic efforts to continue to develop Georgia's network of public transportation systems.
- ★ Support innovations in transportation that contribute to the state's competitiveness and economic growth.

### BUSINESS CLIMATE

The Georgia Chamber's Business Climate Committee examines policies related to strengthening and expanding Georgia's business-friendly climate and competitive advantages. Broadly, the Committee considers topics related to tax structure, pro-growth policies, and regulations such as maintaining right to work laws.

## ENERGY AND NATURAL RESOURCES

The Committee analyzes and advocates on federal and state energy, conservation, water, and natural resource management issues. It actively responds to federal and state rulemaking proposals. The Committee also works with members of the conservation community to promote endangered species and related policies, including the recent Constitutional Amendment 1, the Georgia Outdoor Stewardship Act.

### HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Healthcare is not only a concern for businesses, but it is increasingly an economic development issue for communities. The Health and Wellness Committee has continued to build on the work of the Georgia Chamber's Healthcare Access Study examining ways to expand access to quality healthcare and improve the way care is delivered to create better health outcomes.

### INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGY

The capacity to innovate is quickly becoming the most important determinant of economic growth. The Innovation and Technology Committee focuses on emerging trends that impact businesses and communities and how to evolve in order to capitalize on these innovations and advancements.

### LAW AND JUDICIARY

Originally focused on tort reform and judicial nominations, the Law and Judiciary Committee focuses its efforts on its amicus brief program, engaging in judicial races, and promoting fair legal policy in Georgia. The Committee worked closely with the Chamber's affiliate, Georgians for Lawsuit Reform, on the successful passage of the Business Court Constitutional amendment in 2018.

### TALENT AND LEADERSHIP

The Talent and Leadership Committee focuses on policies and initiatives that address workforce challenges that are being seen across the state. As the economy evolves, this Committee explores innovative ways to address those issues. In 2018, the Georgia Chamber High Potentials leadership program was launched which provides participants with an opportunity to understand their role within the broader organization enabling them to represent their company effectively and authentically in external environments. This program is only open to Georgia Chamber member companies.

# GEORGIA CHAMBER AFFILIATES

The Georgia Chamber of Commerce has several strategic partnerships with organizations that share our mission of promoting a healthy business environment in our state.

#### **GEORGIA TRANSPORTATION ALLIANCE**

The Georgia Transportation Alliance is the state's only organization focused solely on identifying and promoting long-term transportation solutions specifically connected to economic development and job creation. The Alliance works closely with the Georgia Chamber of Commerce, the Georgia Department of Transportation and other key stakeholders in Georgia and Washington, DC, with the goal of ensuring an efficient and safe statewide multimodal transportation system.

### GEORGIA SCREEN ENTERTAINMENT COALITION

The Georgia Screen Entertainment Coalition (GSEC) is a statewide advocacy group representing the film, television, and digital entertainment industry in Georgia. GSEC works with business leaders, elected officials and other strategic partners to protect and promote the film, television and digital entertainment tax credits that ensure the screen entertainment industry's continued investment in Georgia.

#### THE COUNCIL ON ALCOHOL & DRUGS

The Council on Alcohol and Drugs is a 50-year-old nonprofit, 501(c)3 substance abuse prevention and education agency that develops programs and materials based on the most current research on drug use and its impact on communities.

#### **GEORGIA FOREIGN-TRADE ZONE**

Georgia Foreign-Trade Zone helps companies in Georgia thrive in a competitive global environment by reducing the cost of doing business and opening supply chain efficiencies. The Georgia FTZ helps leaders from diverse industries unlock opportunities to reduce, delay, or even eliminate tariffs and fees, and streamline import/export procedures.

### GEORGIA HISPANIC CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

The mission of the Georgia Hispanic Chamber of Commerce is to promote and support the domestic and international economic development of Hispanic businesses, and individuals, and to serve as a link between non-Hispanic entities and the Hispanic market.
